Peace Memorial Park

This park was constructed as a commemorative facility under the project to make the whole neighborhood of the Nakajima district into a symbol of ever-lasting peace and a recreation area for citizens. Subsequently, the park was renovated into its current design in preparation of the 50th anniversary of the A-bombing. The park, including the A-bomb Dome area, occupies an area of 122,100 m2. The Hiroshima Peace Memorial Ceremony is held in this park on August 6 every year.
