




We strive to make every visit to the museum a positive experience. Get in touch with us if you have any questions.



You will find toilets and cloakrooms in the basement at level -1. There are also toilets within the exhibition areas on all three floors. Baby care and nursing rooms are located in the cloakroom area in the basement on level -1 and on the 2nd floor.

Leave these items in your locker

Jackets, umbrellas and bags/rucksacks larger than an A4 sheet must be placed in the cloakroom before entering the exhibitions. E-bike batteries may not be brought into the museum due to the fire safety risk.



Food and drink can be enjoyed in the café on the 1st floor and the Lounge on the 2nd floor. Only baby food is allowed in the exhibition areas.




You may take your own baby carriage into the museum, but large baby carriages must be parked. A limited number of strollers are available for loan.



Feel free to take pictures in the exhibitions, but remember to turn off the flash on your camera first.



You may not touch the art unless permission is given. Markers in front of the artworks help you keep a proper distance.



There are lifts and step-free access to all parts of the building. Service counters, toilets, and cloakrooms are also universally designed.



Staffed counters and several of the publicly accessible meeting and learning rooms have hearing induction loops, indicated by a symbol.



Guide dogs are welcome in the museum and admission is free for personal assistants with proof of certification.
